#### **DARE PROGRAMME – Years 5 & 6**

The DARE to make a choice programme prepares young people to make responsible choices and decisions, helping them to develop healthy lifestyles and fulfil their potential as individuals. It deals with issues such as building self-esteem, making safe and sensible decisions, understanding the consequence of making wrong choices, resisting peer pressure, solving problems and the influence of the media. It is delivered by Police Education Officers and teachers, and is managed by the NZ Police.

#### **KIA KAHA PROGRAMME – Years 0-4**

The Kia Kaha programme is a series of programmes designed to help schools create communities where everyone feels safe, respected and valued, and where bullying is not tolerated. The programmes have been developed by the Youth Education Service (YES) of the New Zealand Police, working in close association with the Specialist Education Services (SES).

#### USING GOOGLE APPS WITH STUDENTS IN YEARS 3 TO 6

Google Apps are exciting tools that children and teachers can use in the classroom to create, share and collaborate with. After the success of Google Apps last year we have decided to continue using them with students in Years 3 to 6 (and some Junior school children). Each child will have a school email address which is linked to our school's email account, as well as access to their own Google Drive and a selection of Google Apps and a blog. The children will be able to log in to their Google account on any device and parents will be able to view their child's work using the parent portal - which will be set up during the year. To help us successfully manage and protect the use of Google Apps with so many students we will continue to use a management system called Hapara. This allows each teacher to view what is in their child's drive and to also monitor incoming, outgoing and deleted emails, as well as what is being posted on their blogs. For us to use this system there is a cost of \$1 per term per student for the year. So \$4 will be added to your child's term account for this year. If you have any questions regarding the use of Google Apps please see your child's teacher.

#### Seesaw

Last year a few classes began trialling an APP called Seesaw. This is an online portfolio of the children's work. Each child has their own folder and they submit work to be uploaded to their portfolio. Once this has been checked by their teacher it is posted into their folders and if you download the APP and connect to your child, you will be able to see what your child is sharing/learning about and make a comment or provide feedback. You will need to link to your child for this to happen (instructions for how to do this will be given out by your child's teacher).

Last year we were using the free trial version, however this year we have upgraded to the paid version - this allows the children's work to move with them as they change classes and well as a number of other features. The cost for this will be \$5 per child for the year and will be added to their account.

From feedback from parents last year whose children used Seesaw, we believe that this is an incredibly powerful tool which provides parents with a real time view of their children's learning and motivates children to share their learning with their parents.

#### **TERM ONE INQUIRY**

Our Term One inquiry is 'Healthy Mind, Healthy Body' focusing on what the brain and body need in order to be happy and healthy.
