SCHOOL UNIFORM UPDATE

The uniform has now been finalised and approved by the Board of Trustees and will be on display in the office before the end of term with a full price list. Information on this will also be included in a newsletter around the same time. Families can purchase the uniform from the school from the beginning of next year and a range of samples will be available for parents to confirm sizes. The uniform will be optional for 2012, compulsory for students year 5 and below from 2013, and compulsory for all students from 2014.

The uniform is in the East Taieri School colours of jade and navy and consists of a polo top, a choice of skort or culottes for girls, shorts for the boys, a polar fleece, merino jersey, tracksuit pants and jacket. Parents can select their preference from these items. The current sports top can also be worn, and children can wear their own raincoats if preferred. All items have our school logo.

The committee would like to thank parents, staff and the Board for all their suggestions and recommendations. While catering for everyone's wish list was difficult, we have tried to accommodate those of the majority. Consideration was given to not only price and quality but also our climate and how active our children are.
