EAST TAIERI SCHOOL UNIFORM – Parent Election

Due to the number of enquiries made over the last 18 months the Board of Trustees will be conducting a poll of parents as to their preference of either retaining the status quo or introducing a compulsory school uniform. Samples of what the uniform could look like are now on display in the office. If adopted the basic set up cost would be approximately \$200.00 per child. The Board would like to see the current sports uniform retained and should a school uniform be adopted, it would be in keeping with this. Voting papers will be distributed to families next week. There will be one vote per child currently attending, year 5 and 6 will be excluded. If the majority of parents support the introduction of a uniform it will be phased in during 2012.




