- Students taking control of their own learning.
- Passionate teachers who want to make a difference to their children.
- Fantastic resources.
- Great organisation in each class area.
- Teachers working collaboratively and enjoying it.
- Children engaged and motivated to learn.
- Teachers able to articulate their philosophy and then show how they were acting on that and putting it into practice.
- Students engaged (despite visitors!)
- School direction consistent even though it was at a different pace across the school, in order to meet teacher buy in.
- Fantastic art around the school.
- Junior play based learning looked great. Will be bringing my Jnr syndicate leader and new entrant teacher back if that's ok.
- Great children reflecting stable systems and aligned expectations. Have a few I could swap with you.
- Collaboration well established and embraced by teachers.
- I would like to bring my senior leaders to talk to Jennifer and teachers. Your school direction and culture lines up well with ours.
- Collaboration and excitement around it
- Students who could articulate their learning and their choices and who seemed committed to their learning
- On task behaviour
- Attractive displays/provocations
- Library weather display was stunning
- Staff and students very friendly and open/welcoming
- Children in senior area were able to show their learning was at a conceptual level not just recall of facts but "What will we need to cope with extreme weather?"






CAN DRIVE


